

What is Curriculum for Wales?

Curriculum for Wales is our new national curriculum. It became statutory for all Primary schools in Wales from September 2022. A national framework determines the necessary knowledge, skills and experiences and approaches to assessment.



Curriculum at Glan Usk

At Glan Usk, we have used this framework to develop our SHINE Curriculum, which is our school level curriculum.

Our curriculum is designed to meet the needs of our children in our local community and local context.





Our SHINE Curriculum

Our SHINE Curriculum includes all of the learning experiences and assessment activities planned for our children to progress towards the Four Purposes.

We have been developing our curriculum since we became a Pioneer school in 2015, working with the Welsh Government to develop the Curriculum for Wales.

It has been an ongoing process of innovating, reflecting and refining. We have sought and acted upon the views of our children, staff, parents, Governors and our community. We have ensured that our work is informed by excellent practice and educational research.



Our School mission to 'Excite, Challenge and Empower' is realised through a relentless pursuit towards three visionary principles:

- *We make learning irresistible
- *We strive for equity and excellence
- *We nurture our community



Our whole school approach to wellbeing underpins everything that we do and incorporates 5 elements:

*Safety
*Belonging
*Efficacy
*Agency
*Love and Care

We have 5 values based REACH Behaviour Expectations, which are underpinned by a restorative approach.


Our curriculum will also include:

Cynefin - our sense of belonging and Welsh identity






In developing our curriculum we have...



- -Become familiar with the CfW documentation.
- -Read and reflected on the What Matters statements and the Principles of Progression for each AoLE.
- -Engaged in surveys with parents, carers, Governors, our cluster and the local community.
- Worked with out cluster to develop frameworks mapping the concepts of each AoLE 3-16.

Our next steps are to delve deeper into the LLC and Humanities AoLES in 2022-23 to ensure that we have accurately mapped the essential knowledge skills and experiences across the cluster.







Bilingualism

English is the main language of communication, teaching, learning and assessment.

We are committed to developing Bilingualism. We promote oracy, reading and writing in both English and Welsh Second Language in informal and structured situations. We use Welsh around the school, for example, during school assemblies and concerts, in our signage and displays, in lessons and indoor and outdoor activities.

Religion, Values and Ethics (RVE)

Religion, Values and Ethics is mandatory for all learners aged 3 to 16. RVE is still locally determined and therefore, as well as having regard to the Curriculum for Wales Framework Guidance, we also use the Newport Agreed Syllabus for RVE.

From September 2022, there is no parental right to withdraw children from RVE.





Relationships and Sexuality Education (RSE)

'RSE is a positive and protective part of the Curriculum for Wales. It plays a central role in supporting learners' rights to enjoy fulfilling, healthy and safe relationships throughout their lives.' (Welsh Government).

Our RSE curriculum provides the knowledge, skills and values for children to understand how relationships and sexuality shape their own and others' lives.

We use the mandatory RSE Code to support the content of RSE across the school. The content is set within the context of broad and interlinked learning strands:

- relationships and identity
- sexual health and well-being
- empowerment, safety and respect

Learning about rights and equity runs through all the strands, as well as embedding learning and experience through a rights-based approach to the learning.

These will be taught and explored through a variety of specific lessons and curriculum contexts and will be developmentally appropriate for all children.

RSE is mandatory. There is no right to withdraw from RSE from September 2022.



Supporting Learner Progression at GUPS



Our clear cycle of assessment fosters relationships and supports all learners to make progress from their starting points in both learning and wellbeing.



Progression is guided by Descriptions of Learning which provides information on how learners should progress within the Statements of What Matters for each Area of Learning. These are expectations across a period of time and broadly relate to the ages 5, 8, 11, 14 & 16.

At Glan Usk this means:

Progression Step 1: Nursery, Reception & Year 1
Progression Step 2: Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 & Year 4
Progression Step 3: Year 4, Year 5 & Year 6



GUPS Metacognition Superheroes



We support the children at Glan Usk Primary School to become efficacious learners by developing their 'learning behaviours' and metacognitive skills. They learn 'how to learn'!

These behaviours are integral to our curriculum and to learning and were developed using research and evidence informed practice, initially based upon the work of Guy Claxton (Building Learning Power).

6 'Metacognition Superheroes' support our children to develop these learning behaviours over time, through fun characters. Each character has their own story of how to be a better learner using the characteristics of the learning behaviours they represent; Resilience, Effort, Motivation, Collaboration, Achievement and Independence.

We aim to equip our children with the skills and language to reflect on their learning, to find ways to solve problems and know what to do when they 'get stuck'. Our language of learning is used by staff from Nursery to Year 6 in a developmentally appropriate way so that pupils can talk meaningfully about their progress.
